## Stars of Basketball to Shine in Melbourne

The superstars of the National Basketball League and Women's National Basketball League will gather in Melbourne on Friday 19 March for the 2010 NBL/WNBL Awards Dinner to witness the announcement of the Most Valuable Players of both competitions.

In one of the true gala events on the sporting calendar, the elite of Australia's basketball family will attend as the annual awards for both the NBL and WNBL are presented in a combined ceremony at the prestigious Palladium Room C at Crown Casino in Melbourne.

The highlight of the event will be the presentation of the Most Valuable Player awards to those two athletes who have been the best of the best in the NBL and WNBL this season.

The outstanding player of the 2009/10 season for the men's NBL will receive the Andrew Gaze Trophy as the Most Valuable Player. Past winners have included Leroy Loggins, Scott Fisher, Chris Anstey and of course the man the award was named after, seven-time recipient Andrew Gaze.

Some of the greatest names of the women's game have taken home the WNBL MVP trophy previously, including Robyn Maher, Rachael Sporn, Penny Taylor and Lauren Jackson. A number of past winners of the men's and women's awards will be in the audience to welcome the new recipients to basketball's most exclusive club.



Other men's awards that will be presented on the night include NBL Coach of the Year, NBL Rookie of the Year, NBL Best Defensive Player, NBL Most Improved Player, NBL Best Sixth Man and All-NBL First Team. The WNBL will also present their Coach of the Year, Rookie of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year.

The night will commence at 6:30pm and limited tickets are now available for \$150 (plus GST) per ticket or a table of 10 for \$1,500 (plus GST).

The latest round of Association Development Grant funding has now become available for associations.

Basketball Victoria has identified the need, through the continuing growth of basketball statewide, to offer affiliated associations the opportunity to apply for grants of up to \$1,000 to help develop basketball within their region.

Programs/Projects that are undertaken with funding should also aim to be sustainable within the Association beyond the initial funding.

## U20 Victorian State Teams Announced

The 2010 Victorian Under 20 State Teams who will contest this month's Australian Championships in Gawler, South Australia, have been selected after a series of tough try-out sessions.

Both teams have a proud history at the National Championships and these players will be looking to continue this tradition. The Men's Championships have been running in 1974, and over the past 36 years, Victoria's Men have taken the title 20 times. Our women's team also have an equally stunning record with 15 titles since the Women's Championships began in 1981.

From within both the men's and women's teams, there is only 1 player returning from the 2009 campaign. Alice Kunek of Eltham Basketball Association will be heading to Gawler full of determination, aiming to bring home another Gold medal to add to her collection.

The U20 Men have been training over four weekends, improving each session as they come together as a group. "We are aiming to defend aggressively on each possession" said coach Scott Christiansen "From this, our style of play will be very up tempo."

Coach of the Victorian U20 Women, Lori Chizik is also looking to play an up tempo style of basketball. "This year's team is very talented and I expect all players to make a significant contribution to our campaign" said Chizik.

Both teams have extremely committed players and staff. All eyes are firmly set on replicating the previous success of our state and bringing the National Championships back to Victoria yet again.

## WNBL Finals Start with a Bang

The Bulleen Boomers will be hunting a place in the Grand Final on the weekend, as well as a chance to avenge their only loss of the season, when they take on the Sydney Uni Flames at Knox Stadium at 3.00pm this Saturday.

The First Semi Final match-up sees the league's two top finishing sides meet head-to-head.

Bulleen finished on top of the ladder at the end of the regular season with a record of 21-1, while Sydney Uni moved into second position in the final round, finishing one game clear of the Canberra Capitals with a record of 17-5.

The clash will be the third meeting between the sides for the season, with each team having stolen a win from their opponents, away from their home floor thus far.

In Round 3 Bulleen went to Sydney and walked away with an 80-71 victory, as a near triple-double from Bulleen guard Jenna O'Hea, nullified 22 points and ten rebounds from the Flames Suzy Batkovic-Brown.

The second game between the two was held at the Veneto Club back in Round 7. On that occasion the Sydney Uni Flames withstood the loss of veteran Natalie Porter to a broken wrist to record a 79-65 victory.

Young centre Liz Cambage led all scorers for Bulleen on the day with 19 points, to go along with 11 rebounds. But with Batkovic-Brown nailed to the bench with foul trouble, it was Flames physically imposing forward Eva Afeaki who led the way with 20 points for the victors.

The winner of this game moves on to a Grand Final in two weeks time, while the loser faces the unenviable task of a potential Preliminary Final game next weekend against a fired up Lauren Jackson and her Canberra Capitals, who were pipped at the post for a second chance placing of their own.

The Flames will be desperate to win and give their superstar centre Suzy Batkovic-Brown another week off, giving her every chance to make a miracle return to their line up, after suffering a serious knee injury in the lead up to the finals.

One player who will return for the Flames this week is Eva Afeaki. She was instrumental in helping her side orchestrate Bulleen's only loss of the season, with her efforts in the contest earning her WNBL Player of the Week for Round 7.

In fact the two sides boast the winners of WNBL Player of the Week in 9 of the 17 regular season rounds, clearly a great indication of the current form of the players from the league's two best teams.

Eva Afeaki (Rnd 7), Suzy Batkovic-Brown (Rnd 8 and 9) and Deanna Smith (Rnd 11 and 13) have taken home the award for the Flames, while Elyse Penaluna (Rnd 1), Liz Cambage (Rnd 10 and 13) and Jenna O'Hea (Rnd 15) have all been bestowed the honour for their outstanding performances for the Boomers.

## 'PayMySport' Service

It's the time of year when your thoughts turn to taking payments for registrations for the winter season, and PayMySport is now here to make it easier for everyone.

PayMySport works with your existing TBN database to simplify the process of receiving payments for registrations and merchandise online.

Already, we have seen associations accepting payments for all sorts of things:

- domestic club registrations
- association fees
- camps and clinics
- representative players fees
- even for merchandise!

PayMySport is simple to setup - your association doesn't need to set up a bank merchant facility. Instead, all you need to do is apply online for a free PayPal Business Account, complete and return the PayMySport User Agreement and then you'll be ready to accept online payments. Transaction fees of 3.9% apply, provided as a simple, all in one fee. There are no monthly account keeping fees or annual renewal fees.

Players (and parents!) can then pay their association or club fees online, automatically updating their registration status and removing the hassle of receiving and banking cheques and cash. Providing an online payment facility also provides convenience for your members, getting more people to pay you on time.

SportingPulse will introduce a set-up fee for PayMySport from March 1, to cover the time and manual work it takes to set up each club and association, and provide them with initial support. Sign up before 1 March to save the \$200 setup fee.
