

Waverley Basketball Association has adopted Basketball Victoria's Photography policy since 2005. To view the policy in full <u>click here.</u>

Upon annual review of this policy, WBA will be making clear to members of all ages:

- 1. Photography and Videography will be captured by a WBA staff member of families and players on and off the court, inside the Waverley Basketball Centre and all other venues used for competition.
- 2. WBA will be improving and increasing its online presence and using social media platforms and the Waverley Basketball website to advertise, promote, and celebrate all programs, competitions and basketball activities. You or your child may appear on these platforms.
- 3. WBA will be improving and increasing the use of digital screens throughout the venue to advertise, promote, and celebrate all programs, competitions and basketball activities. You or your child may appear on these screens.
- 4. WBA's 'Digital Content and Social Media Administrator' as well as other WBA staff members will be recognizable to all visitors and members of the association by wearing appropriate attire when capturing content.

Should any person take objection to the photographing or videoing of their child during junior basketball activities, they must inform WBA in one of two ways;

- 1. Politely approach the photographer and bring this to their attention by providing the players details and a reasonable explanation as to why they cannot be captured on film, or
- 2. Email your local Club Delegate/President with the player's information and the reason they object as above. Junior Club Delegates will keep a record of all players and provide this information to WBA accordingly.

Any player exempt from being captured on film will remain on record and the ban will continue until such time that the player finishes playing junior basketball and turns 18 years of age.

If the person objecting has a legitimate and substantial reason why they have an objection, then the photography or videoing will cease immediately. An example of a strong reason may be that the child concerned is the subject of contested custody proceedings or has been the subject of violence or threats and publication of a video or photograph may compromise the safety of the child.

Should any person take objection to the photographing or videoing of themselves during junior or senior basketball activities, they must inform WBA in one of two ways;

- 1. Politely approach the photographer and bring this to their attention by providing your own details and a reasonable explanation as to why you cannot be captured on film, or
- 2. Email WBA competition administrators directly with this information and the reason they object as above.

Any player over the age of 18 and exempt from being captured on film will remain on record for a duration of twelve months, after which time the participant or spectator must contact WBA if they wish to reinstate the ban again
