

The HOME team must supply a competent person to act as a scorer and timekeeper. This is a mandatory playing condition. The home team is the first team listed on schedules, and the team displayed on the left-hand side of scoring consoles and the score board.

Seniors: Both teams must supply a competent scorer in divisions that have a shot clock in operation

Juniors: Both teams must supply a competent scorer to act as a scorer and timekeeper

## LIVESCORE MONITORS

Teams must complete the LiveScore monitors with details of all players prior to the commencement of the game. The minimum number of players on court without incurring a forfeit is four. Games will be forfeited if a team is not ready to play within ten minutes of scheduled starting time. If a team is late for a scheduled game, they will be penalised one point per completed minute to the referee's discretion, and the game will go on.

## **SCORING DISPUTES**

Scoring discrepancies must be dealt with immediately at the time of incident, as this can affect the way the remainder of the match is played. For example, if you believed your team was ahead by a point in the final minute of the game, you will most likely not rush any shots and protect the ball more.

However, referees are permitted to correct errors at anytime until the last 2 minutes of the game, at which point referees have until the next dead ball to correct any error.

The best way to deal with these matters is to calmly alert the referees on the game to the issue. If the referees are not able to adequately deal with the matter, a player or team representative should seek out the Referee Supervisor immediately.

WBA is governed by the FIBA Rule Book (www.fiba.com) and WBA Bylaws (www.waverleybasketball.com)

The rules state that once a result has been agreed upon by scorers and referees and signed off accordingly at the conclusion of the match, it cannot be changed.

## VIDEO EVIDENCE

WBA will only use venue cameras (not including CCTV) to determine the result of a match if it can be determined there has been a failure of process when alerting officials and venue staff of the issue during the match.

A scorer or referee error does not immediately constitute a failure in process.
