COMPETITION LADDERS

## LADDER POINTS - LADDER POSITIONS ARE DETERMINED USING THE PP\% FORMULA

$\mathrm{PP} \%$ is the percentage of how many points a team has won, against the total possible points they could have won.

| WIN | $=3$ POINTS |
| :--- | :--- |
| DRAW | $=2$ POINTS |
| LOSS | $=1$ POINT |
| FORFEIT | $=0$ POINTS |

Using the figures above, if your team has played ten games, teams could potentially have a maximum of 30 points (10x3pts).

- If you've won all 10, you'll have $30 / 30$ points, or $100 \%$ PP\%
- If you've lost all 10, you'll still have 10/30 points, or 33\% PP\%
- If you've forfeited all 10 , you'll have $0 / 30$ points or $0 \% \mathrm{PP} \%$

The main benefit of this ladder system is that it takes into account the number of games a team plays. This is fairer for teams that have more byes than other teams, or teams that join the competition late.

- If you've won 4 out of 8 games, you would have $66.6 \% \mathrm{PP} \%$ ( 16 out of a possible 24 points)
- If you've won 5 out of 10 , you would also have $66.6 \% \mathrm{PP} \%$ ( 20 out of a possible 30 points)


## LADDER POSITIIN

At the conclusion of a regular season, if two teams are equal on $\mathrm{PP} \%$, the ladder position will be determined by the team with the most overall percentage.

Percentage is calculated by the number of total scores made against the total number of scores made against the team, then multiplied by 100.

- If you've scored 100 points and had 100 points scored against you, you'll have 100\%
- If you've scored 100 points and had 50 points scored against you, you'll have 200\%
- If you've scored 245 points for the whole season, and had 290 points scored against you, you'll have $(245 \div 290=0.8448) \times 100=84.48 \%$


## OTHER NOTES REGARDING LADDERS

In cases where a team gives a walkover and forfeits a game, the result will be recorded as a $20-0$ win to the non-forfeiting team.

Ladders are not used or displayed in Under 8 Competitions.
Senior grading games do not count towards regular season ladders.
Junior grading games are not counted towards regular season ladders.

## ABANDONED GAMES

Abandoned games refer to situations where a game cannot continue due to circumstances beyond the control of either team.

Games abandoned before halftime will be recorded as a 2-2 draw.
If a game is abandoned after half-time is signalled, the score at the time of abandonment will be recorded as the final result.
